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Competition Rules and Regulations

Guidelines:

1. There can be max of 3 students in one project.
2. There cannot be overlapping of student in multiple project.
3. Every team will be provided with a stall to display the project.
4. Participants should carry their school ID cards.
5. Teams need to prepare charts/banners and synopsis related to the project work.
6. Electricity will be provided in the stalls if required and mentioned in registration form. Any other requirements for the conduction of the experiment should be mentioned during the registration on registration form.
7. Only one plug point will be provided. If needed, the teams need to bring in their own multiple points.
8. The models will be made by the students at their institutions/schools and will be brought to display on the competition day.
9. Participants should be present at the venue by 8.30 AM and projects should be demo ready by 9.30 AM
10. Any sort of misconduct will lead to disqualification.
11. Model can be built using any medium i.e. Paper, Plastic, Thermo pore, Metal etc. Use of recycled and waste material is encouraged.
12. Each school can send 1 teacher per category.

Project Synopsis:

Each project/model is required to have written project synopsis A4 pages. It should be not more than three pages and must include the sections highlighted below:

- **Rationale**

The rationale should be based on student thought process and should explain why students chose their identified problem/issue, and elaborate on the exploration route chosen and what was done.

- **Methodology**

Students need to identify their specific approach and what they did or plan to do to address the identified issue (the inclusion of pictures, graphs, interviews, timelines, etc. is encouraged. Explain the rationale behind the development of the prototype, awareness campaign and model.

- **Next Steps**

In this section, students will explain what they learned and what they could do next with additional resources (time, materials, etc.)

- **Bibliography**

All sources used in project and the paper referenced in the Bibliography. Students should strive for variety.

Judgement:

The following areas are used to evaluate projects:

- **Rationale**
Clearly identify the source of inspiration for the project. Ensure that the project idea is relevant to the identified community within the paper. Support the idea chosen with robust independent thinking.
- **Scientific Accuracy and Content**
Overall scientific content and accuracy. In particular, potential impact and application of the concept and how well the details of the project are communicated in the written project.
- **Bibliography**
All sources used in writing the paper must be referenced in the Bibliography. Sources must be clearly labeled.
- **Description of Project**
Use of scientific thinking when providing an overview of the project. Incorporation of an innovative and/or creative approach within the project.
- **Next Steps**
Propose potential next steps of the project if given more time and resources. Utilize evidence and critical thinking supported by factual evidence.
- **Project Explanation**
Clarity and confidence while explaining project
